New no-wake law in place across Wisconsin

A new slow-no-wake boating rule took effect statewide this spring. The new Wisconsin state law prohibits boaters in all lakes and river flowages from operating at speeds faster than slow-no-wake within 100 feet of any shoreline.

The new law adds to an existing one which already prohibits boaters from exceeding slow-no-wake speeds within 100 feet of all piers, docks, rafts and buoyed restricted areas.

According to the Department of Natural Resources, the change was made to protect people and the bodies of water where they play. Excessive speed is a primary cause of both boating accidents and complaints about boaters during the summer season. The new rule should also reduce shoreline erosion and also protect aquatic plants near shore.

So slow down near shore and make sure you know the rules, or you might get a ticket.
